PERRY COUNTY – In another sure sign of spring, tax bills for Perry County property owners arrived in mailboxes the week of April 4<sup>th</sup>. The scheduled mail date is April 5, 2022.

Perry County Treasurer Amanda F. Lasher would like to remind Perry County tax payer's that the first (Spring) installments of property taxes will be due (Tuesday) May 10, 2022. Tax bills mailed in April include coupons for the May and November payments, and this will be the <u>only</u> bill property owners will receive in 2022. Any payments made or postmarked **after the 10<sup>th</sup> will be considered late** and be subject to a late fee. Also, Amanda is excited to announce you may view your property information and tax bills at www.lowtaxinfo/perrycounty.

To help get your taxes paid in time, taxpayers can make payments in person at the Treasurer's office in the courthouse from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday (closed 12-1 for lunch). On Monday & Tuesday, May 9 & 10, the office will be open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

A <u>drop box</u> is located outside in the turnaround in front of courthouse for after-hour payments. However, cash should not be placed in the drop box. Payments can be <u>mailed</u> to 2219 Payne St, Tell City IN 47586 (address located on the tax bills) or paid at our <u>local banks</u> with tax coupon at Fifth Third Bank, German American Bank and Old National Bank. Checks must be for the exact amount of tax due (no cash).

Payments can also be made <u>online</u> using a debit or credit card, but a convenience fee is charged by the company processing the transaction. The fee is 2.5 percent of the total when payments are made at the courthouse or online, and 4.95 percent when the taxpayer calls the company directly.

If a taxpayer would like a receipt returned to them, they must include a self-addressed stamped envelope with their payment. Questions concerning property <u>tax bill payments</u> should be addressed to the <u>Treasurer's office</u> at (812)547-4816 (Treasurer – Amanda F. Lasher).

The <u>tax rate/bill</u> amount is determined in the <u>Auditor's office</u> and also responsible for managing/filing the <u>deductions & exemption</u>. It is the tax payer's responsibility to file these deductions. Please make sure that these deductions are filed by December 31, 2022 for taxes payable next year. If you have any questions or concerns regarding the exemptions/deductions that you may be eligible for please call the <u>Auditor's office</u> at (812) 547-6427 (Auditor – Pam Goffinet).

<u>Mortgage and Deeds</u> are recorded in the Recorder's office. Any questions on how something is recorded, please call the <u>Recorder's office</u> at (812) 547-4261 (Recorder – Jane James). The Recorder office also has a free property fraud alert that you can log into <u>www.propertyfraudalert.com</u> or stop by the office and they can help you.

<u>Assessed value</u> of your property is done in the Assessor's office. Personal Property forms are due May 17, 2022. For more information on personal property or questions on ownership of mobile homes, contact the <u>Assessor's office</u> at (812) 547-5531 (Assessor – Mendy Lassaline).
